Public Participation Plan

OVERVIEW

This Public Participation Plan (PPP) provides a framework for gathering input from the public to help guide all phases of the Calumet County Comprehensive Plan update. As required by [Wisconsin Comprehensive Planning Legislation](#) (s.66.1001), this plan will provide written procedures that are designed to foster public participation in the plan update process. Included in the process are opportunities for the public to engage in open discussion, provide written comments, and attend public information and feedback meetings.

Public participation is an essential step in creating a Comprehensive Plan that is accepted by the community and reflects the community sentiment. The comprehensive plan process will provide opportunities for community members to participate and engage with the planning and decision-making process and shape the course of the Plan. This PPP identifies specific public engagement opportunities, along with roles, responsibilities, and actions for each opportunity to be carried out.

Calumet County recognizes that the community is a vital source of local knowledge and expertise that can be used to help identify local issues and opportunities, as well as solutions to countywide challenges. Successful Comprehensive Plans are built from consistent and accessible public participation, and weaves public feedback from residents and interest groups throughout the plan.

This Plan outlines opportunities to engage the public through a variety of activities, including:

- Community Surveying
- Open House and Community Workshops
- Popup Events
- Working Group Meetings
- Municipality Engagement

DEFINITIONS

The following terms are commonly used throughout this PPP, and the corresponding definitions provide a baseline for how the term is used.

Community: a group of individuals living, playing, and working within Calumet County, with individual interests, investments, and goals.

Interest Groups: Groups or individuals with interests in Calumet County, including community organizations, regional/state entities, and business groups.

Engagement: Opportunities to connect and collaborate with the community and stakeholders on a specific topic to inform, consult, involve, collaborate, or empower groups in a decision-making process.

Promotion and Branding: Activities and aesthetics to encourage education, participation, and awareness of the planning process and engagement activities.

AUDIENCES

INTRODUCTION

This Public Participation Plan (PPP) is intended to guide engagement throughout the Calumet County Comprehensive planning process. To engage with all segments of the community, various engagement methods are proposed, including virtual opportunities, in-person meetings, and activities. This process aims to be fun and engaging while also informing the audience of the plan process to foster valuable engagement.

All residents of the County are encouraged to be actively involved in the planning process. Outreach includes virtual and public notices of upcoming events and opportunities (described in detail in the Promotional Tools section of this document). Overall, the foundation of the PPP is intended to provide accessible and equitable engagement options for all community members.

WORKING GROUP

The overall process will be guided by a Working Group, including representation from the County and other municipalities. The group will meet at key stages in the planning process and serve as the first line for review and feedback on plan drafts, deliverables, and engagement materials. Five key timepoints have been identified throughout the planning process:

- Meeting #1: Project Kickoff
- Meeting #2: Issues and Opportunities
- Meeting #3: Vision and Goal Setting
- Meeting #4: Plan Element Analysis and Land Use Scenarios
- Meeting #5: Draft Plan Review

MUNICIPALITY ENGAGEMENT

Engaging each participating municipality will be a key part of developing an effective plan. To ensure that each participating municipality can review plan documents and provide feedback throughout the planning process, specific outreach will occur in-person and virtually. The planning team will work with each municipality to schedule meetings at four key timepoints throughout the plan development process:

- Engagement Series #1: Project Kickoff
- Engagement Series #2: Issues and Opportunities
- Engagement Series #3: Vision and Goal Setting and Land Use/Plan Element Analysis
- Engagement Series #4: Draft Plan Review

INTEREST GROUPS

The project team has identified critical interest groups and will continue to identify others that will be engaged throughout the planning process. Interest groups are typically a good way to include individuals from several agencies, organizations, or groups from the county. The following list includes a sampling of interest group categories that have been identified by the planning team. Efforts will be made to identify and connect with specific groups in these categories and others as identified to not only promote the planning process but to gather feedback.

ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

The project team recommends a phased engagement process. This provides several opportunities and methods for community members to participate in the process and coordinates engagement events with the project timeline to ensure that input can be incorporated as the plan is developed. It also ensures transparency with the community and stakeholders, while keeping them updated on the status of the plan. Specific engagement tools and strategies that will be used include:

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT TOOLS AND ACTIVITIES

The project team will use traditional open houses, online engagement tools, and pop-up methods of engagement to meet people where they are. Throughout the planning process, the project team will evaluate activity success to ensure that continued engagement activities cater to the needs of the community and to maximize participation.

Each engagement activity will look to collect public input, educate the public on comprehensive planning, and provide updates about the planning process and the purpose/intent of the plan.

Online Engagement

A project webpage will be developed by the project team to share the community survey, update the community on planning progress, advertise engagement events, and share draft plan materials. The website will be updated throughout the planning process to ensure that the most up to date information is available to the public. Further, interactive engagement opportunities, such as interactive mapping and community surveys, will also be accessed through the project website.

Community Surveying

Community Surveys are opportunities to engage residents at an early stage of the planning process and gather initial feedback about their likes, dislikes, and hopes for Calumet County. The first survey will occur early in the planning process and be used to solicit community opinions that will be used to identify issues and opportunities and to identify overarching community vision and goals. If needed and applicable, additional surveys will be provided at later stages in the planning process.

Surveys will be disseminated via an online engagement tool for easy distribution and access. Physical surveys will be made available and distributed for community members who need alternative options.

Open Houses/Public Workshops

Two in-person open houses and public workshops will be held during the planning process. These special meetings will allow the project team to interact directly with community members to solicit feedback, share information, and educate the public about comprehensive planning.

Meeting materials, including recordings of presentations, will be made available online for community members who are unable to attend the meetings.

Popup Events

The project team will facilitate four pop-up engagement opportunities at community events. The intention of these events is to meet people where they are and get input from those who may not visit a project website or attend a traditional open house. Pop-up events tend to reach more people than traditional events because they do not require participants to make special plans to attend. The project team will identify opportunities to host pop-up events at various stages in the planning process.

A Comprehensive Plan project website will share information and updates about the plan process and public engagement opportunities. and materials. The project team will also provide written monthly updates to municipalities for inclusion on board and commission packets.

Social Media

The project team will use Calumet County's existing social media accounts to promote the project and advertise specific engagement opportunities. Additionally, social media will provide a space for promoting planning activities to a larger audience. The project team will also work with local partners to provide content for their social media outlets.

ACCESSIBILITY

Project staff will provide convenient engagement opportunities to the maximum extent practicable. Any in-person engagement activities will be hosted at locations with ADA accessible facilities. Virtual engagement activities and live virtual meetings will include opportunities to participate for those without broadband access.
